
In Maths, we have been learning about money. We set up our own shops at home to practise using coins. We were very busy serving customers!

3rd Class – Room 13



Hi everyone,



Zain is learning to take care of his new pet dog Poppy and he is working very hard at his new workstation.






Alfie is enjoying the time at home. He is spending lots of time in his new sensory garden and loves seeing his friends on Zoom calls.


EAL Class
